
# Thank you to Chris Mayes for the generous donation to the Kuna Historical Society!

Miss Eunice Day is spending the week in Boise, a guest of Miss Margaret Bush.

Mr. and Mrs. H. Hughey of Parma visited friends in this city a few days the latter part of the week.

During a short but rather severe storm Friday evening lightning struck and seriously damaged one of the semiphores near the depot in this city and the wind blew down the silo on the Hubbard ranch in the north part of town.

Dr. S. T. Bayles was in town this week and has decided to cast his lot with the Kuna people. He has rented an office above the bank.

Kuna-A. H. Hays and family left Saturday for La Grande, Ore., where he has accepted a position as superintendent of ward schools.

Sam Jerome has purchased the Ben Dawson place south of the track.

Misses Eunice Day and Arlene Hale left Sunday for Lewiston to attend school, and Howard Forrey left on the same day for Moscow.

Rev. C. D. Day leaves Tuesday for conference which will be held at Payette. He will be away our next Sunday.

The Ladies' Aid Society met Friday with Mrs. Thomas and elected the following officers for the coming year: President, Mrs. G. H. Hogue; Vice President, Mrs. C. D. Day; Secretary, Mrs. Lucy R. Teed; Treasurer, Mrs. J. Neglay.

School opened Tuesday with 100 pupils enrolled with several more to appear later. There were between 80 and 90 enrolled last year.
